<p>Interprofessional Team Practice for Error Management IPE100-600-700</p> <p>Also known as Interprofessional Group Near Peer Integrated Team Education (“IGNITE”)</p>	<p>Due to the interdependent, team-based nature of this program, students <u>must be able to attend the entirety of all four sessions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sept. 29 – 9am-5pm* • Oct. 20 – 9am-4pm • Nov. 17 – 9am-4pm • Dec. 8 – 9am-5pm* <p>*Session is followed by optional networking reception</p> <p>Students can expect to spend ~5hrs on team and/or independent study prior to the 1st session & between each session.</p>	<p>There are no a priori exclusions based on academic program or level of experience</p> <p>Space IS limited however, and students from certain programs may be given priority to ensure a sufficient level of interprofessionality</p> <p>Prior completion of TeamSTEPPS is required</p>	<p>Interested students should consult with their Dean or Chair to ensure their availability and the appropriateness of their participation. Once approved by their Dean or Chair, students should email ipe@samuelmerritt.edu for information on how to <u>register during their normal fall registration period</u></p>	<p>This is a 2-unit, pass/fail elective which occurs during the fall semester. In this course, 8 interprofessional teams of ~8 students are exposed to various instructional modalities including simulation- and problem-based learning to understand how an interprofessional team of health care practitioners can effectively address errors that occur in clinical practice. Students learn about effective interprofessional team communication, how errors occur, how they can be prevented, and how their impact on patients/clients, family caregivers, and health care practitioners can be mitigated.</p>

TBD) - 8:30am-5:30pm <p>Between the live events, students can expect to spend ~5hrs/week performing independent research & tasks, collaborating with their team & advisors, and possibly visiting individuals with complex health and social needs. Activities will include live and virtual meetings and the presentation of administrative or patient cases during monthly virtual “case conferences”.</p>	<p>There are no a priori exclusions based on academic program or level of experience</p> <p>Space IS limited however, and students from certain programs may be given priority to ensure a sufficient level of interprofessionality</p> <p>Prior completion of TeamSTEPPS is required</p>	<p>Interested SMU students must complete an online form (http://bit.do/ipe-2018) by 11:59pm on May 31.</p> <p>Those who complete the form will be emailed a link to a full application by June 5.</p>	<p>This is a co-curricular experience offered for no credit, but a student may be able to use this experience to meet certain requirements of their academic program. (Please consult your Dean or Chair). In this program, teams of ~6 students from at least 3 professions work with one another and 2-3 advisors to discover, learn about, and work with challenges that cause people with complex health and social needs to frequently visit the emergency department and hospital instead of other, more appropriate health and social services. When possible, teams will be linked with a healthcare organization that can connect them to complex patients who the team will work with to identify the underlying unmet needs driving their frequent visits. This program is NOT designed for students to intervene in the patient’s clinical care. Rather, students work to support and empower patients in accessing appropriate health and social services.</p>

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Patient Safety & Communication Simulation	<p>This experience occurs in the spring semester and requires several hours of pre-work (completion of various IHI Open School online modules) and participation in <u>one</u> of thirteen 3.5-hour simulation experiences that are generally held on a weeknight or Saturday morning or Saturday afternoon</p>	<p>Space is limited and priority is given to PA, OT, PT and ELMS-N students for whom this experience is a course requirement.</p> <p>Participation by other students may be considered depending on space, and students from certain programs may be given priority to ensure a sufficient level of interprofessionality</p> <p>Prior completion of TeamSTEPPS is required</p>	<p>Interested students should consult with their Dean or Chair to ensure their availability and the appropriateness of their participation. Once approved by their Dean or Chair, students should email ipe@samuelmerritt.edu by <u>January 31</u> for information on how to sign-up for one of the scheduled simulation experiences.</p>	<p>Unless required as a component of an existing course (please consult your Dean or Chair), this is a non-credit, co-curricular IPE experience.</p> <p>After completing pre-work on medical errors, error disclosure and effective teamwork/communication, students will participate in a 3.5-hour IPE experience with two interprofessional teams of ~8 students. The experience will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A teambuilding session on provider and patient roles, stereotypes and generalizations • A simulation in which half of each 8-person team is assigned to be action learners, and the other half observer learners • A whole-team debriefing of the simulation
Allen Temple Baptist Church (ATBC) Holistic Health Fair	<p>This experience occurs over the summer semester and culminates with participation at an annual health fair in East Oakland sponsored by Allen Temple Baptist Church. At minimum, students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete pre-reading assignments related to event logistics, roles and responsibilities during the month of July, • Participate in <u>one</u> of three, 1-2 hour orientation sessions held at noon or 5pm the week prior to the event, • Complete an early (9am-1pm) and/or late (11:30am-3:30pm) shift at the event on Sat. Aug. 11, and • Participate in <u>one</u> of two lunchtime debrief sessions held during the middle of Aug. <p>Additional leadership opportunities are available to assist with event planning and onsite management.</p>	<p>There are no a priori exclusions based on academic program or level of experience</p> <p>Space IS limited however, and students from certain programs may be given priority to ensure a sufficient level of interprofessionality</p> <p>Prior completion of TeamSTEPPS is required</p>	<p>Interested SMU students must complete an online form (http://bit.do/ipe-2018) by <u>11:59pm on May 31</u>.</p> <p>Final assignments will be communicated with additional information no later than June 29.</p>	<p>Since 1977, Allen Temple Baptist Church has held an annual health and wellness event for the residents of East Oakland – a region with significant health disparities.</p> <p>Over the last few years, SMU has increased the number of volunteers at this event and worked to make our participation more strategic to ensure we're meeting demonstrated needs of the community in a manner that is sustainable and builds local capacity.</p> <p>Historically our volunteers have provided screenings, education/behavior modification and referrals related to blood pressure, obesity, and (pre)diabetes. This year we hope to better collaborate with ATBC and local stakeholders to support area resources that can meet the needs of community members well after the one-day event.</p>
