

Registered Nursing Programs at SMU

Samuel Merritt University has multiple degree programs leading to the Registered Nurse (RN) licensure including: the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program, Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN) program, and the pre-licensure portion of the Entry-Level Master of Science in Nursing (ELMSN) program. SMU's programs are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). Graduates of Samuel Merritt University's BSN and ABSN programs, and students who have completed the pre-licensure component of the ELMSN program, are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) exam in all US states, territories, and commonwealths including the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, with the exceptions noted below. However, RN licenses are granted by the licensing authority in individual states and certain licensing boards may require a curriculum comparison specific to that state. Prior to enrollment, prospective students must review the information below. It is strongly recommended that prospective students review the required curriculum governed by their local state board of nursing education before enrolling in our program.

The California Board of Registered Nursing is the licensing authority for California and requires an exam on the laws and regulations for practice of nursing in California. Samuel Merritt University will assist applicants and students as they determine licensure requirements in other states.
