Outstanding Occupational Therapy Student Award

This award is given to the student who has demonstrated a commitment to service, has a strong academic record, and has demonstrated a high level of professionalism and outstanding teamwork.

Outstanding Physical Therapist Student Award

This award is given to a graduating student who has demonstrated strong leadership while in the program and outstanding achievement in at least two of the three following areas: service, clinical practice, and scholarship. This award is meant to exemplify the highest level of achievement and potential in relation to the mission and values of the Department of Physical Therapy.

Podiatric Medicine Scepter Award

The Scepter Award was established by the former California College of Podiatric Medicine Board of Trustees and the College of Podiatric Medicine (CPM) Alumni & Associates to symbolize their commitment to academic excellence. Each year the graduating students and the faculty have an opportunity to recognize a member of the senior class who exemplifies the scholarly

and humanitarian qualities of podiatric medicine. The Scepter is symbolic of the attributes of mind and heart that characterize the true podiatric physician.

Delta Phi Tau National Physical Therapy Student Honor Society

Graduates who have been inducted into the National Physical Therapy Student Honor Society have demonstrated excellence, integrity, and professionalism in areas of academic achievement, leadership, and service during their time as a student.

Pi Delta National Podiatric Medicine Honor Society

Election into Pi Delta recognizes high standards of intellectual and scholarly activity. Students inducted into the Pi Delta Society must be in the top twenty percent of their class after the second academic year and must maintain at least a ninety percent grade point average thereafter. Graduates who are members of Pi Delta can be identified by the gold honor sashes worn with their academic regalia.

Graduation Speaker

The student graduation speaker rotates on a yearly basis among the programs. In 2025, the Department of Occupational Therapy had the honor of selecting the student speaker. For the Master of Occupational Therapy graduating class, the student was selected by the department faculty to deliver the speech following a review of all submitted speeches.

Other Occupational Therapy Honors

In keeping with department tradition, the chair leads the graduates in the procession.

Other Physical Therapy Honors

Graduating DPT students elect a member of their class who they believe represents leadership and professional values to lead the graduating class during the procession.

Other Podiatric Medicine Faculty Honors

Each year members of the graduating class participate in a balloting process to determine those faculty members who will lead the graduates in the procession and hood the candidates. Faculty members who are so honored at graduation are considered by the students to best represent the ideals and principles of an educator and a physician.

Samuel Merritt University Interprofessional Education (IPE) Passport

Interprofessional Education (IPE) is anytime health professionals learn from, about, and with each other. IPE is a core part of healthcare, and Samuel Merritt University aims to make IPE a core part of the SMU student experience.

The IPE Passport allows SMU students to engage with Interprofessional Education – and more importantly, Interprofessional Practice & Education – at their own pace, depending on

the student's individual level of interest and schedule. Participation in most IPE activities at SMU is elective.

The SMU IPE Passport is divided into three levels: Level 1 (Preparatory) is comprised of activities that are self-paced, completed online, asynchronously (within the IPE Passport Canvas course) and provides learners with core foundational knowledge about IPE.

Level 2 (Foundational) is comprised of TeamSTEPPS (Team Strategies and Tools to Enhance Performance and Patient Safety) training. Most students take part in TeamSTEPPS training within one of their existing SMU courses within the first two terms of their academic program.

Level 3 (Applied) is a menu of synchronous, interprofessional learning opportunities.

Students must complete at least two activities. In order to complete the entire IPE Passport, students must complete all three levels prior to graduation.

The graduates wearing blue, white, and green cords are recognized as IPE participants.

Tutor Coordinator

Tutor Coordinator is a student leadership role within the Academic Support Department.

These students provide targeted academic support for their programs through workshops, mock exams, and one-on-one support. They also serve as the leaders for the tutors in their respective programs by voicing concerns and communicating needs to the professional staff. Overall, the Tutor Coordinators are exceptional students who chose to dedicate their time at SMU to helping others succeed.

DR. SAMUEL MERRITT

A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY

SAMUEL MERRITT, MD was born in 1822 in Harpswell, Maine, and graduated from the Medical School of Maine at Bowdoin College. After practicing medicine in Plymouth, Massachusetts for three years, Dr. Merritt joined the great migration of 1849 to California. Here he made his fortune as a businessman and his reputation as one of the leading founders of the Bay Area.

When Dr. Merritt died forty years later in 1890, the *Oakland Tribune* called him the man most prominent in the establishment and building of the City of Oakland. He had touched every aspect of public life here, serving as the thirteenth Mayor of Oakland, and one of the original Regents of the University of California. Dr. Merritt played a significant role in the creation of Lake Merritt and the construction of the Oakland Public Library and City Hall. As the first president of the Mountain View Cemetery, he continued to influence the architectural landscape of the city. In his will, Dr. Merritt provided for the establishment of Samuel Merritt Hospital and the training school for nurses that has now evolved into Samuel Merritt University.

Dr. Merritt died before Samuel Merritt Hospital and its school were built. However, his fortune and forward thinking made the founding of the institution possible. Today the women and men who carry on his mission —as students, faculty, and staff — are looking ahead to the next one hundred years. The transformation of Samuel Merritt University in the twenty-first century continues the tradition started long ago by this extraordinary individual who had a mighty vision for the quality and well-being of the East Bay community.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

The history of the academic dress worn by those participating in the graduation processional reaches far back into the early days of the oldest universities. The academic costume consists of the gown, hood, cap, and tassel. The hoods worn by the participants are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university from which they received the degree. The edging of the hood is in widths of two inches, three inches, and five inches for the bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees, respectively. The color of the hood edging is indicative of the subject to which the individual's degree pertains. For all academic ceremonies the colors associated with the different subject areas are as follows:
